### 1. Skyline Princess Cruise

This 3.5-hour tour features a buffet dinner as you soak in the sights of the New York City skyline and iconic landmarks like the Brooklyn Bridge, The Statue of Liberty, One World Trade Center and more.

### 2. TopView Bus Tour



A hop-on, hop-off bus tour can be an efficient, easy way to see the city without having to drive or navigate the subway. Travel through Times Square, 5th Avenue and more as you see popular destinations up close like the Empire State Building, Rockefeller Center, Little Italy, Wall Street and more. The double-decker busses run in a continuous loop throughout the day to make it easy to get on and off. Plus, this tour includes a two-hour bike rental and free admission to the Museum of the City of New York.

#### 3. New York City Helicopter Tour



If you're looking to see Manhattan in a whole new way, perhaps an aerial view would do the trick? This 17- to 20-minute helicopter ride will give you a bird's eye view of some of the skyline and more, including the Statue of Liberty, Ellis Island, The Empire State Building, The Brooklyn Bridge, Central Park, Yankee Stadium and much more.

# 4. Catacombs Under Basilica Of St. Patrick's Old Cathedral

Here's one off the beaten path: Explore the underground catacombs of the Basilica of St. Patrick's Old Cathedral (the one in Lower Manhattan, not the St. Patrick's Cathedral on Fifth Avenue). This 90-minute tour will take you through areas normally off-limits to visitors, like two walled cemeteries and the catacombs beneath the old cathedral.

### 5. NYC Gangsters & Chost Tour



This two-hour tour will walk you through some of New York City's most famous neighborhoods like Little Italy, The Five Points, Chinatown and West Village, where most of New York City's most-famous gangsters have done their "business dealings." Guided by local historians, you'll visit old crime scenes and learn all about NYC's criminal past . . . plus some spooky ghost stories, too.

# 6. Horse-Drawn Carriage Tour Through Central Park

# 8. Harlem Sightseeing & Apollo Theater Walking Tour

### 9. The Edge Observation Deck

This brand new NYC observation deck sits 1,131 feet above Tenth Avenue on the 100th floor of the 30 Hudson Yards building, making it the 2nd-highest outdoor observation deck in the Western Hemisphere. It features 360-degree views of just about every part of Manhattan as well as a 225-square-foot triangular glass opening that looks down at the streets below. This place is on-point to get some memorable photos and views most people haven't even seen yet.


